

Permanent Makeup, also known as Micropigmentation, is a procedure applying pigment into the dermal layer of the skin.

Swelling: Swelling may occur during or after the procedure. Ice packs may be directly applied to the tattooed area to reduce swelling.

Infection: Infection is unusual after permanent makeup. Bacterial and viral infections can occur. If you have a history of Herpes Simplex Virus (cold sores) it is possible to have a recurrence following permanent makeup. Specific medications must be prescribed prior to the procedure in order to suppress an infection from this virus. Should any type of skin infection occur, additional treatment including antibiotics may be necessary.

Bruising: Bruising may occur on or around the tattooed area. Bruising will go away and heal completely in the days to follow the permanent makeup procedure.

Poor Results: There is the possibility of poor results from these procedures. Due to unknown factors, pigments in the skin may completely slough off leaving no pigment behind. Also, pigments chosen for your procedure may not stay true to their original color. You may be disappointed with the final results of permanent makeup.

Unknown Risk: There is a possibility that additional risk factors of permanent makeup that may be discovered.

A touch up procedure is required. The touchup is included in the overall cost of the procedure. Your touchup can be performed NO earlier then 6 weeks but must be completed within 3 months of the original tattooed date, if not, additional charges will be applied.

Increase sensitivity to the tattooed area is expected after the procedure and can last for up to 6 weeks.

All post care instructions **MUST** be followed – see handout.

Preparing for your permanent makeup procedure:

- arrive 15 min. prior to your appointment to fill out additional paperwork
- if you wear contacts, please wear your glasses
- come with no makeup on your face or eyes
- be prepared to be laying down on your back for 2-4 hours
- if you take any blood thinners, please talk with your Doctor to see if you are able to discontinue your medication prior to your procedure
